COVID-2019: Updated CDC Guidance, Specimen Collection and COCA call

Actions Requested

- Understand recent changes to the CDC Guidance on Infection Prevention and Control for Patients with Suspected or
 Confirmed Coronavirus Disease 2019 in Healthcare Settings available at: https://www.cdc.gov/coronavirus/2019-ncov/infection-control.html
 - o For care of patients with known or suspected COVID-19, facemasks are an acceptable alternative when the supply chain of respirators cannot meet local demand. Eye protection, gown and gloves continue to be recommended.
 - When collecting diagnostic respiratory specimens (e.g. nasopharyngeal swab) from a possible COVID-19 patient:
 - Healthcare personnel in the room should wear an N-95 or higher-level respirator (or facemask if a respirator is not available), eye protection, gloves and a gown.
 - Specimen collection should be performed in a normal exam room with the door closed.
 - Clean and disinfect procedure room surfaces promptly following environmental infection control recommendations.
