# COVID-19 Updates: Testing Guidance, 24-hour CDC Hotline, and Kitsap Data Dashboard

### **Actions Requested**

 Be aware of updates to the Washington State Department of Health COVID-19 Testing Information for Healthcare Providers (update 5/27/2020)

- Test all patients with symptoms consistent with COVID-19, even if symptoms are mild, if adequate test supplies are available.
- Ensure specimens and requisitions are labeled correctly and completely. Washington law requires healthcare providers to include: patient name, date of birth, address and phone number.
- Use a PCR-based test, the preferred diagnostic test for COVID-19, which has demonstrated higher sensitivity and fewer false negatives than currently available point-of-care tests.
- False negative results can occur. If indicated and suspicion is high, a person with a negative test should be retested and complete recommended quarantine or self-monitoring.
- o Indeterminate results do not rule out COVID-19 infection and retesting should be considered.
- Be aware that serology or antibody tests are not recommended for making a diagnosis of COVID-19 or to reliably determine whether or not someone has experienced a past infection with COVID-19.

    - If your clinic begins COVID-19 testing and you would like us to add you to our testing map, please call (360)728-2235.
- Continue to report all positive COVID-19 test results immediately to Kitsap Public Health Communicable
  Disease staff at 360-728-2235. If you report via KPHD secure fax, 360-813-1168, provide the lab result, patient
  name, date of birth, and phone number, and indicate if the patient has been notified of their positive result.
   Report the following:
  - RT-PCR positive results
  - o point of care PCR positive and negative results
  - repeat positive results for an individual but please be aware that repeat testing is not generally recommended by Washington State Department of Health.
  - serology positive results, Kitsap Public Health Communicable Disease staff will investigate all serology positive results to determine if a case can be classified as probable based on clinical evidence and/or epi-linkage.
- Advise all patients when you test for COVID-19, that if their test is positive, Kitsap Public Health will be following up with them by phone.
- Notify Kitsap Public Health Communicable Disease staff within 24 hours of any death associated with a positive COVID-19 test by calling 360-728-2235.
- Notify Kitsap Public Health Communicable Disease staff of any suspected cases of Multisystem Inflammatory Syndrome in Children (MIS-C) associated with COVID-19 by calling 360-728-2235.

### **Background**

8,991 Kitsap County residents have been tested for COVID-19, 174 have had a positive result and 2 Kitsap County resident deaths have been associated with COVID-19 as of 2PM on June 11, 2020.
