

REGION 2 NOTIFIABLE CONDITIONS SURVEILLANCE REPORT

SEPTEMBER

In Washington State, there are more than 80 conditions which health care providers must, by law, report to local public health.* Table 1 presents the case counts of conditions for which Clallam, Jefferson, or Kitsap County had at least one case reported in the current year to date (YTD). For comparison, the case count each county had by this month (YTD) last year is shown. A 5-year annual average number of cases provides a baseline of expected cases for an entire year; the 5-year average helps "smooth out" any artificially high counts due to outbreak years. Notifiable conditions not listed in Table 1 are those for which no cases were reported for any of the counties during the current year. Table 2 includes rates for a sub-set of high volume conditions (i.e., those with average annual rates >30 cases per 100,000 for at least one of the three counties). The YTD rates (number of cases reported YTD divided by the annual population estimate[^]) are shown for both the current year and last year. A 5-year average annual rate (average of rates for the previous 5 years) provides the expected rate for a complete year.
