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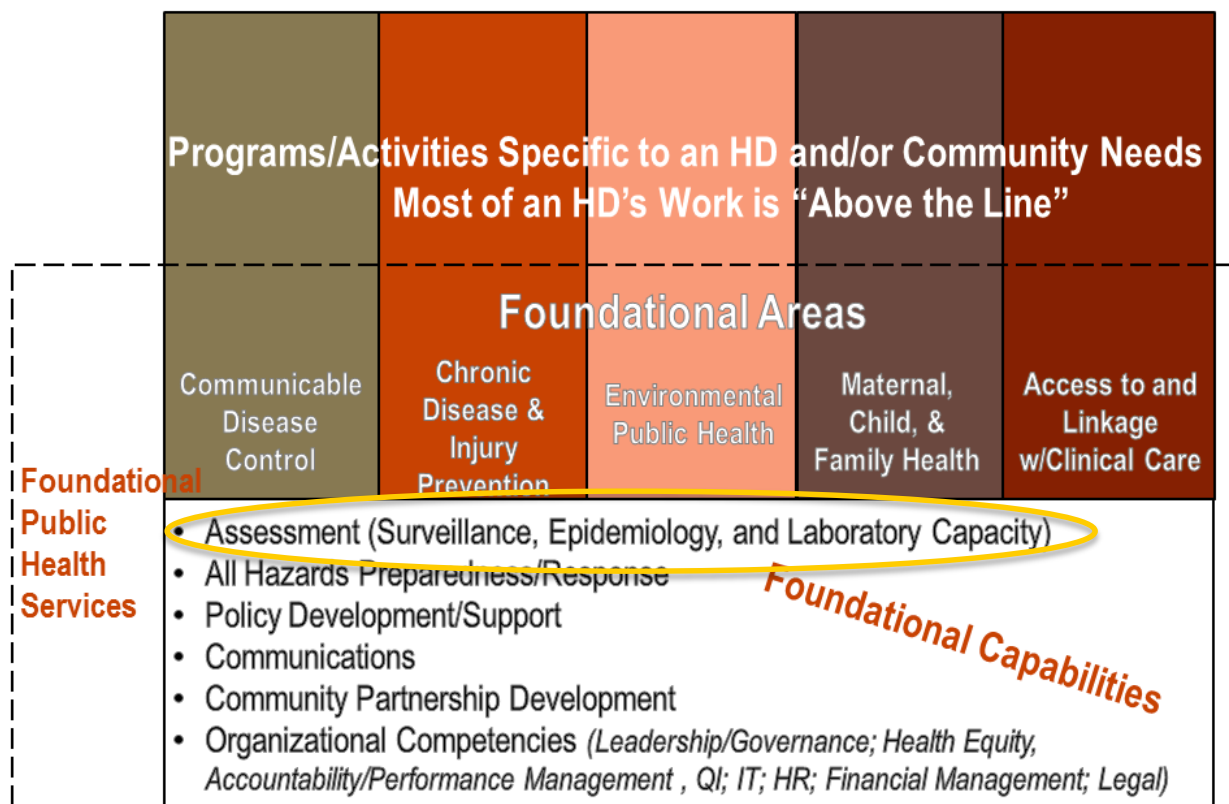

# Background

- Indicators report developed in 2006 and updated annually since
- Demographic and public health data for an overview of the health and well-being of Kitsap residents and surroundings
- Data used to assess current status and track trends



# What do the health indicators tell us?

They tell us about:

- our entire county
- some age groups youth, adults, older adults

They don't tell us about:

- different county areas
- different sub-groups (gender, all age groups, race, income, education, etc.)

# How are the data organized?

- Over 80 indicators in five sections:
  - Demographic profile
  - Who are we?
  - How healthy are we?
  - How healthy are our lifestyles and behaviors?
  - How safe and healthy are our surroundings?
- Data presented as rates and percentages
- Statistical trend over time
- Statistical comparison to Washington State for most recent year
